A free and impartial Support Service for Parents, Carers and Young People involved in the Education, Health and Care Needs Assessment Process

The Independent Support role has been developed to support and enable families with children who have special educational needs and/or a disability to improve their educational, health and social outcomes.

This project has been developed in response to the introduction of the Children and Families Act 2014. Independent Supporters provide free, impartial support to parents, carers and young people living in Cheshire East, offering:

- Support with transfer of a Statement of Special Educational Need (SEN) to an Education, Health and Care (EHC) plan
- Support if you are considering requesting an EHC needs assessment for your child or if you are a young person who wishes to apply for an assessment for yourself
- Information on the Local Offer and Personal Budgets
- Information and signposting to other relevant services
- Advice to all children, young people and their families who are going through the EHC process.
